
New Playground!

After a lot of planning, saving and fundraising, our new playground is finally open! This construction was fully paid for by the school and the P&C. Between the money the school has been saving over the past few years and a fantastic fundraising effort by our P&C, stage 1 of our new playground is open and ready for play.

We had great support from Peter Butler of Complete Playground Services to design and build this play area. Once we had all the planning in place, it took less than a week to complete so there was minimal disruption to the school.

When we opened it on Thursday, Ezra was the lucky one to have first go. We spent time with most classes, running through our playground behaviours:

NAIDOC incursion

Last Tuesday, as part of our NAIDOC celebrations, a visit was organised of Australian native animals. The incursion fitted in with our students learning about local wildlife in their Noongar language lessons. The presenters talked about the care of our local fauna, the importance of habitat and what to do if you find an injured animal. The highlight of the visit were the animals. Whether they were furry, sleepy, cute or slithery, they were a big hit!







Application of medication for bites or scratches

There has been a change in the interventions we can provide at school in regard to bites and stings. We are no longer allowed to apply any medication without parent permission. The directions for first aid we have been given are:

To manage insect bites:

- Wash the area with soap and water
- Dry the area with disposable paper towel.
- Consider using cold packs, which may help with local pain and swelling.
 If medication to provide relief from itching is required, seek permission from parents prior to administration.

The directions for minor cuts are similar with the addition of covering the injury with a band aid.

As with any injury, if it is serious, if it is a known allergy to your child or if your child is distressed, we will let you know.

Interschool Events

This week we have two interschool athletics events. On Tuesday, a team of about 40 students from years 3 to 6 will participate in the jumps and throws day. A similar group will compete in the running and team events on Friday. Both events will be at the Collie football ground. At this stage, the forecast for both days is reasonable. Please make sure that your child has a hat and applies plenty of sunscreen. Students who are competing have already received a note. Parents and family members are welcome to come along and cheer on their children. Good luck, team!
